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


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


# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

# SOUTH ASIAN AND TAMIL WOMEN'S COLLECTIVE

The South Asian and Tamil Womens Collective (SATWC) is a grassroot, community based organization that creates spaces for intergenerational connection, growth, and learning for South Asian and Tamil women, girls, and gender diverse communities.

SATWC creates programming and events in the community that focuses on career development, leadership, mental health and well-being using an anti-oppressive and equity lens.



#### WHAT IS SOUTH ASIAN?

The term South Asian is a colonial and racial construct (Gandhi, 2014). Historically, it served to problematically group individuals from particular nations together - Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, India, Bhutan, and Maldives - for the purposes of political, economic and geographical conquests (Shankar, 1999).

We recognize the complexity of this racialization, as the term South Asian was also used to identify individuals who were indentured, required refuge, and immigrated from these regions to all of the world's continents. (Gnanadass, 2014).

#### **South Asian Identities**

We recognize that groups within the disapora have suffered at the hands of targeted political and civil actions, oppression and genocide. It is important to name the intentional historic and on-going erasure of Tamil and minoritized identities from South Asian conversations. We do not take this intra-diasporic tension lightly. We know that intra-cultural differences arising from faith, culture, and traditions are used as tools for neo-colonial oppression to divide our communities from collective efficacy (Anouch, 2014).

We want to reclaim the term South Asian to represent the diaspora as a whole. We are committed to striving for solidarity amongst all the diverse communities by recognizing differences and intentionally fostering unity.

#### **GENDER AND IDENTITY**

We recognizes that women and gender diverse communities have multiple identities that converge to produce distinct experiences of discrimination, privilege, and oppression. We are using an intersectional lens in understanding that lived experiences are shaped by the interaction of overlapping factors including race/ethnicity, gender, class, sexuality, geography, age, ability, migrant status, and religion.



# WHY ARE WE DOING THIS RESEARCH PROJECT?

The 2016 Canadian Census reported that South Asians represented one of the largest visible minority groups, making up over 25% of the total visible minority population

- To gather information on the employment realities, needs and lived experiences of young women and gender diverse folks within this community

- To design spaces for discussion and develop recommendations with community on needs, solutions, and areas of continued action

#### Research Plan & Approach

Conduct a Literature review, launch an online survey, and host virtual and in-person learning circles

#### Data Analysis

Analyze and theme key data, and review findings with community advisors

#### **Knowledge Mobilization**

Synthesize research findings to develop a report, infographics and social media content


#### **Community Summit**
